

Over the last few years Banasthali Vidyapith is steadily emerging as an international academic destination. Be it the enhanced number of MoUs for international collaborations, student exchange programmes or as a hub for research activities, it has scored high on all aspects. The Department of Bioscience & Biotechnology is currently facilitating an international scholar under the

TWAS Fellowships for Research and

Advanced Training Programme, an international venture between the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India and the World Academy of Sciences, Italy. Arrival of TWAS scholar to our campus is another instance of accolades the research in sciences has achieved.

The World Academy of Sciences (TWAS) is a global science academy based in Trieste, Italy, working to advance science and engineering for sustainable prosperity in the developing world. It offers 470 PhD fellowships with 14 partners in eight countries, and over 150 postdoctoral fellowships with 16 partners in nine countries. TWAS offers fellowships to young scientists in developing countries to enable them to spend three to twelve months at a research institution in a developing country other than their own. The purpose of these fellowships is to enhance the research capacity of promising scientists, especially those at the beginning of their research career. helping them to foster links for further collaboration.

Excerpts of an interview with Mr. Emannuel Iwaula, the TWAS scholar, from Nigeria by Newsletter reporters

Q. Tell us something about yourself.

A. I am Emannuel Iwaula, from Nigeria, a country in the western part of Africa. I am a Ph. D. student and I'm associated with the fellowship

program, 'The World Academy of Science' in collaboration with the Department of Biotechnology. Government of India. I came from the University of Lagos in Nigeria to Banasthali on July 19, 2016 and my fellowship is of a year. So I'm here for this entire academic session.

Q. What is your research all about?

A. I'm working on the molecular characterization of genes responsible for droughts in maize and millets.

Q. Who has been supervising you?

A. My supervisor is Dr. Afroz Alam, Associate Professor, Department of Bioscience & Biotechnology.

Q. How did you get to know about **Banasthali University?**

A. Through the internet and the DBT, Gol while locating options of renowned specialized laboratories to conduct my research under the TWAS fellowships for Research and Advanced Training program, I came to know about Prof. Vinay Sharma's lab.

Q. Why Banasthali?

A. For the fellowship I had applied to few institutions including the International Crops Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT) which is in collaboration with Africa. Meanwhile I got positive response from Prof. Vinay Sharma whose laboratory is quite renowned in the research circles. Now I feel lucky that I came to Banasthali and I believe 75% of my objectives will be met here.

Q. How did you find Banasthali? How has your stay so far been?

A. It's alright, I guess. Dr. Vinay Sharma is very helpful and supportive. For research purposes, it's fine. It's just that I'm yet to adapt to the climate.
